HOCKING HISTORY

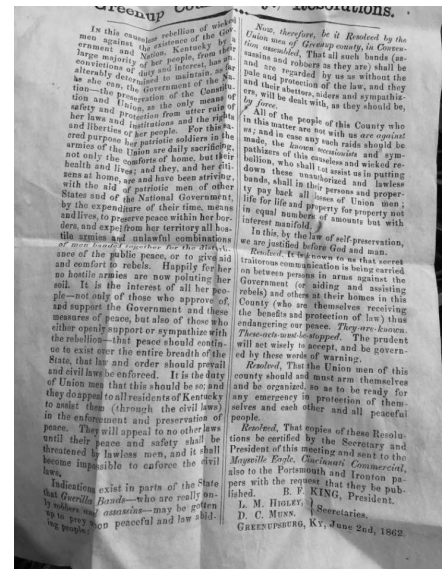
Picture it: Ohio, the 1800's. Native Americans fiercely held to their land, Ohio was a young state bursting with industry. Cars had yet to come about, and later, tensions would heat as Lincoln took presidency. To the owners of 21785 Clay Lick road, a one time Stagecoach Inn, this was their everyday life.

Earlier this year, current owner of this inn, Joshua Haislep, during renovations of the building, discovered an ancient secret buried under a series of floorboards being replaced. To his surprise, a large quantity of personal correspondence between past owners of the inn had been tucked into the floor for well over a century, well preserved after all those years. Currently, less than ten of an assumed hundred plus letters have been read, one notable paper, a notice of death concerning a Union soldier, is dated to 1862, 156 years ago.

In an interview with Mr. Haislep concerning the future of the documents, he explained, "I don't want to make money off

them or anything, I just want people to be able to appreciate them." He is slated to visit state professionals at Ohio University some time this fall to more accurately have the documents analyzed and looked at before deciding their future. His focus has been toward donating the correspondence to the local Historical Society so that the whole of Logan, and the public, can freely view some of our oldest, most well preserved history face-to-face.

Hurricane Michael

In early October, Hurricane Michael devastated parts of the Florida panhandle, and in particular Mexico Beach. The category 4 hurricane made landfall on October 10, bringing with it a projected storm surge of up to fourteen feet, destroying low-lying homes, and even causing some trailers to be swept away and moved several yards. The storm brought more than a foot of rain, as well as winds as strong as 150 miles per hour. The storm reduced many homes in Mexico Beach to piles of rubble, and so far has been blamed for about 35 fatalities, 25 of them in Florida, three in North Carolina, one in Georgia, and six in Virginia.



Some of the long-term effects of this storm include the widespread loss of property and money. Many residents of Mexico Beach plan to leave the area permanently, because of the devastation, and the property can not be sold for much money at this point in time, due to it being seen as disaster-prone, as well as it already being in ruins. The frequency of theft has increased exponentially following the disaster, and looters have been targeting those who may have something they need, or want. Law enforcement in the area is limited due to the destruction the storm caused, and thieves have been taking advantage of this.



Over a million homes were left without power due to the storm, about 1.2 million in total. The majority of these outages were in Georgia, where about 6% of the total population lost power. In Tallahassee, well over 100,000 homes lost power, and the extent of the outages can be seen by satellite.



Tropical storms and hurricanes have been gradually increasing in strength recently, and this may be due to climate change warming the oceans. Hurricanes will most likely increase in both their intensity and frequency in the future, and may greatly affect the same regions left in ruins by Hurricane Michael.

The Death of Magician Harry Houdini

Harry Houdini was a famous magician in the early 1900s. Born on March 24, 1874, Houdini was mostly known for his famous performances: Escaping the Chinese Water Torture Cell and the straitjacket.

On October 31, 1926, the famous magician Harry Houdini passed away of a ruptured appendix or, appendicitis.

A little over a week earlier, October 22, the magician had invited some McGill college students over to visit to ask questions and such.

One of whom was Jocelyn Gordon Whitehead, who asked if it were true that Houdini could resist hard punches in the stomach—which Houdini had supposedly claimed before to the public.

The magician confirmed the rumor but was still sore from his last performance at the Chinese Water Torture Cell in New York, where he was literally hung by his feet in a glass box of water with the challenge to escape.

In fact, Houdini fractured his left ankle after being hit by a leg piece of the equipment. Throughout the rest of his performance, the magician was basically wobbling around.

Anyhow, Houdini still allowed Jocelyn to deliver “four or five terribly forcible, deliberate, well-directed blows” to his abdomen. Although he didn’t prepare

himself whatsoever, Houdini still blew it off and acted like the punches were nothing.

Unfortunately, he had complained of stomach cramps later that evening and by the next day, it only worsened. Houdini began having severe stomach pain, cold sweats, and a high temperature of 104 degrees.

The magician was informed by a doctor that he needed to be checked out at a hospital because he may have appendicitis, but Houdini insisted on performing at his opening night show at the Garrick Theater.

He struggled throughout his performance and after his final act, the performer collapsed immediately. Houdini was then taken to the Detroit hospital for surgery.

During the surgery, his appendix, which would have ruptured about a week later, was successfully removed.

Unfortunately, the appendix had already poisoned Houdini’s insides.

From there, Harry Houdini hung on to his life as long as he could until he couldn’t hold on anymore.

On October 31 of 1926, the famous magician Harry Houdini passed away with his wife Bess and his two brothers by his side.

Doctors discovered that it was peritonitis, which was caused by his ruptured appendix, that took him.

Graduation Points

What do we know about Graduation Points? We know that we need them to graduate, but how do we get them, and why are they required? The state requires that all students have 18 or more graduation points, with at least four points in both Math and English, and three in each Science and Social Studies. This means a student must also go above the minimum score requirements to graduate.

In an interview with Mr. Ramage on the required points, he said "the points are all based off of state AIR Tests." Mr. Ramage explained that the state test "is required, according to state law," and that "this is a state mandate," and believes they are not needed.

The tests we will take in 9th grade, senior Catlin Hoellrich says are "English 1, Algebra 1, and Science." In 10th grade we will take History, Biology, Geometry, and English 2. Finally when we get to our Junior year we

take the Government test. It is important to note that these tests can be differently timed for every student, depending on whether you pass the class or advance early. That is usually all the tests we will take, so for the average student we will take about seven tests.

I asked Mr. Ramage what advice he gives to students trying to pass the test and he said, "Start focusing in class and on tests right away, it's hard for freshman to see what will

happen in four years so when they reach 11th grade it's almost too late, so don't start late or you won't pass." When asked about the dates, Mr. Ramage stated, "It's in April, the dates are not exactly set yet."



The Chieftain Center

Positioned directly across the parking lot from the school, the Chieftain Center will fully come into operation on May 1, 2019.

Beginning construction on April 27th of this year, the center is to be an 80 thousand square foot building, including a full half mile track, basketball, tennis, and volleyball courts, and numerous new classrooms and storage areas for equipment. The building will be available to students and the public after school hours, and will host sports events from the surrounding counties.

Construction this summer has been a little touch and go due to weather such as flooding and extreme heat, delaying the opening of the Center. Acquiring some permits also slowed progress.

Currently, the building is at about “five or ten percent completion,” said Mr. Meyers, who has followed the project since its planning stages. The foundation has been

poured with cement, and currently the frame and internal systems are being built, the ‘bones’ of the building.



Currently, the date of the centers opening is May 1 of next year, but that is likely to be changed before long. This date was originally late this year, but was changed due to the unexpected setbacks

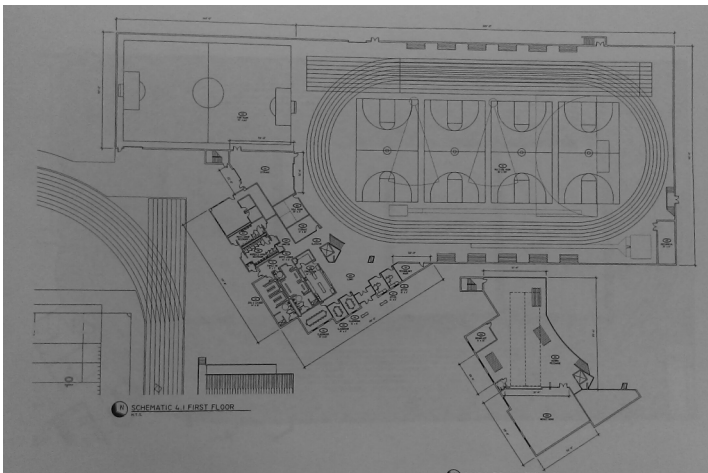
this summer. Winter weather might slow or even stop the project, and early spring melt water might also prove difficult to build around.

Book Suggestions

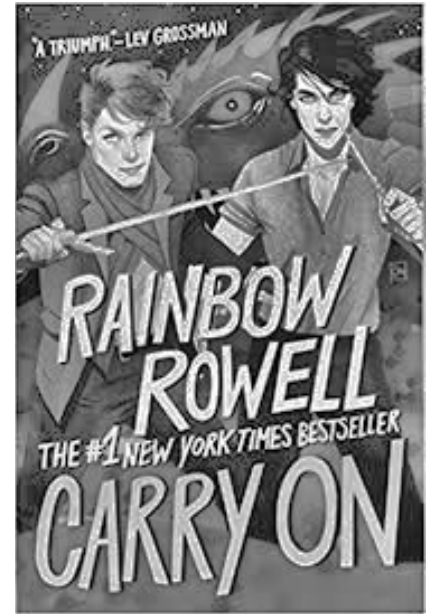

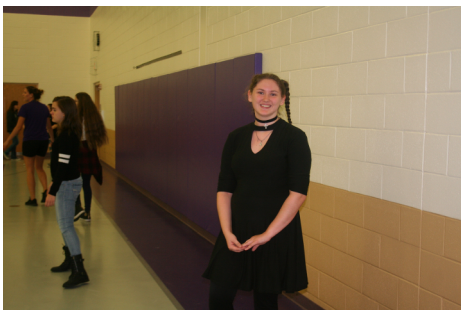

seemed to be the most popular day with students this year. Almost everyone participated that day. We had a lot of participation for the other days, but this theme seemed to have the most participation.



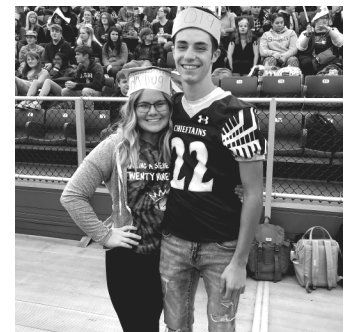
The final day of this year's first spirit week was themed

they are great memories for the future. It is something different to do with friends on the

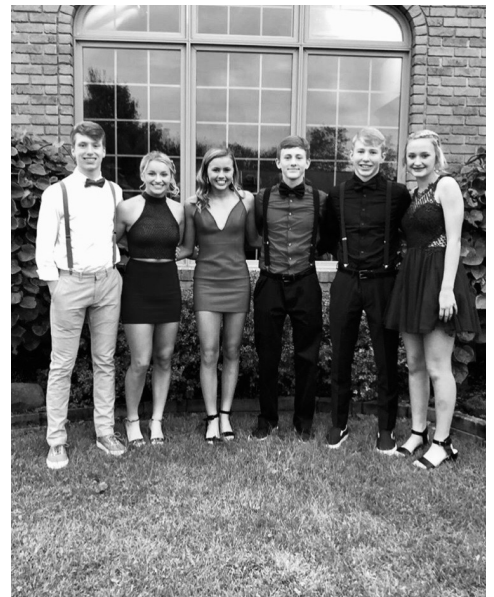

The Mothman

The first recorded account of the Mothman was on November 15th, 1966 in "Point Pleasant", West Virginia. cultures, mainly the Native American cultures.

These tales depict the Wendigo as a gigantic creature over fifteen feet tall.

The appearance of the Wendigo may vary depending on whom you ask, but generally, the Wendigo is said to have glowing eyes, large fangs, and an overly long tongue.

According to the lore, a Wendigo is created whenever a human resorts to cannibalism to survive. Although this isn't normally a common occurrence in today's world, however back in the tribal time's people were sometimes forced to eat those around them just to simply get by.

The most well known and chilling case of Wendigo Psychosis is that of Ka-Ki-Si-Kutchin, more commonly known as Swift Runner. During the winter of 1878-1879, he murdered his wife, mother, brother, and his six children. He was arrested by Canadian police and after he was arrested he confessed to the crime and claimed he was possessed by the Wendigo.

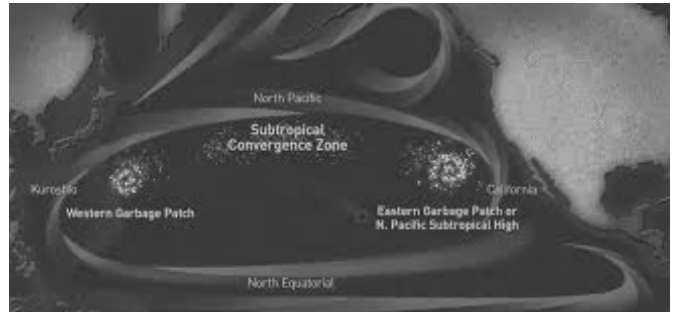
However, he would pay the price of this as he was hung, which was the first official hanging in Canada, on December 20, 1879 at Fort Saskatchewan. Was this just the result of a crazy man, or was it the Wendigo? It's still unclear to this day.

Pacific Garbage Cleanup

Midway between Hawaii and California lies a vortex of ocean currents notorious for the Pacific Garbage Patch, an island of garbage roughly twice the size of Texas. Discovered in the 90's, scientists then thought it would take upwards of a thousand years to clean its three trillion pieces of junk from the ocean. That was until Boylan Slat, a young Dutch man, decided to do something about it.

After dropping out of college, Slat raised over \$2.2 million to create the Ocean Cleanup Project and has since made great headway. As recently as September 18, the Ocean Cleanup Project has published the results of test runs with innovative boats used to clean the Garbage Patch, presenting



an estimated five to 10 years of cleanup time. These boats work by using mile long screens to filter the water as it passes through them, using little energy and resources as the currents passively push trash into the large nets. Boats then pick up this trash over six to eight weeks, it is estimated to take half the patch out of the waters in as little as five years.

Is the Military for you?

Thinking about joining the military? Wondering what branch you should choose? Or, do you already have a branch and career path in mind and you just want to know more?

One option you may consider is the United States Army. Being based and founded for ground warfare, many people associate the army with being a grudge. When really, the army is very technological and has one of the highest leading research and discovery operatives in the country. You must meet these requirements to be eligible to join any enlisted rank in general: you must be a U.S. citizen or a Green Card holder, be in good health, be 17 to 40 years old (different branches have different age requirements, for the army, active duty is 17 to 35 years old). You must also have a high school diploma, and you must also pass the Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (A.S.V.A.B.) test. To be eligible to join as an officer you must have also attended college, (ROTC or Reserve Officer Training Corps. is a program offered by over 1,700 colleges across the United States that prepares young adults to become officers in the U.S. military).

Another option you may be considering is the United States Marine Corps. To enlist you need to be at least 17-28 years old, have a high school diploma, be a legal resident and pass a physical exam. To be an officer you must be 18-27 years old a U.S. citizen, pass a physical exam, have a high school diploma and a Bachelor's Degree. To start, recruit training is grueling and hard, and you will not only be testing your physical boundaries but mental as well. You will be in boot camp for a 13 week period of which you must pass to be able to serve as a marine.

The third option, is the Navy, another very technologically and battle ready branch. The navy has been working on projects like

laser weapons systems (La.W.S.), robotics, and have been incorporating things like V.R. into control panels of ships and submarines to help further technology and to be able to train war fighters in the future. If this interests you, you may want to join a naval research and/or science team. If you're looking for jobs that require more hands-on engineering, you may want to consider Civil Engineering. Civil Engineering includes overseeing the construction of docks, runways, and buildings of all kinds, approve completed work and supervise (Seabees) manage skilled construction workers, and arrange budgets and schedules.



The fourth option you may want to consider is United States Air Force, a very well paying and diverse branch. If you're looking for jobs in technology and mechanics, munitions and missile maintenance, aircraft maintenance, or being a civil engineer could be some of your choices. If you wish to be in a more office or research type of environment then, financial maintenance, or combat systems are a few of the wide-ranging jobs in those fields.

And last but not least, the fifth option, the United States Coast Guard. The U.S. coast guard is a very technological branch and has many jobs to offer in those fields such as an information systems technician, where you would be a manager of all information that heads in and out of the coast guard. Another is a health services technician, where you will learn hands-on medical skills and care for individuals in distress or life-threatening situations. If you're looking for something more hands on then a damage control man might be your pick. A damage control man, or DC is an emergency repair specialist and deals with many maintenance jobs as well.

Creepy Shortwave Radio Stations

There are many things which remain a mystery to people to this day, despite the popularity of the usage of the Internet. Unknown shortwave radio broadcasts are among these, and there are several which one can listen to with either an online wide-band radio or a physical one. Shortwave transmissions are able to be received around the world because they reflect off of the earth's atmosphere and are not stopped by objects, unlike lower frequencies of radio waves. However, most shortwave broadcasts received on a physical radio can only be heard at night, because the sun's radiation ionizes the atmosphere, interfering with the shortwave propagation process.

There are many stations or frequencies on the shortwave radio band which would be deemed as 'creepy', most of these being either stations used by the military, or what are known as 'numbers stations', which are used by many countries to anonymously broadcast coded messages to spies around the world. Shortwave radio is used to do this because the frequencies are received anonymously, and it can be difficult to track the stations where they are transmitted.

Most numbers stations were used during the Cold War, and recordings of these broadcasts can be found on the Internet today. A few of the most famous ones include 'The Lincolnshire Poacher', and 'The Swedish Rhapsody', which are both named for the tunes they play before the typical list of numbers. Unfortunately, these stations no

longer exist and have no assigned frequency today. The most famous numbers stations operating today is 'The Buzzer', a Russian station broadcasting intermittent monotonous, and occasionally interrupting with the voice of a woman reading off names and sometimes numbers. This station can be heard with a radio tuned to 4625 kHz.

A complete schedule for known numbers stations exists on the Priyom.org website, named after the Russian word for 'reception'. On this website, both recordings and live broadcasts of stations such as 'The Pip' (on 3756 kHz at night and 5448 kHz during the day) and 'The Squeaky Wheel' (on 3828 kHz at night and 5483 kHz during the day) can be heard, as well as links to listen to all upcoming numbers stations' broadcasts through an online radio.

All one needs to listen to these stations is a radio, either physical or online, and the schedule for the broadcasting times. The reception may vary drastically depending on where you are located, as certain regions are designated targets for specific frequencies, and often times some countries try to interfere with the broadcast by transmitting tones on the same frequency of the numbers station, or frequencies in a close enough proximity to cause interference. The strangeness of many shortwave radio stations can embellish this year's Halloween experience, especially if you are willing to search the frequencies thoroughly.

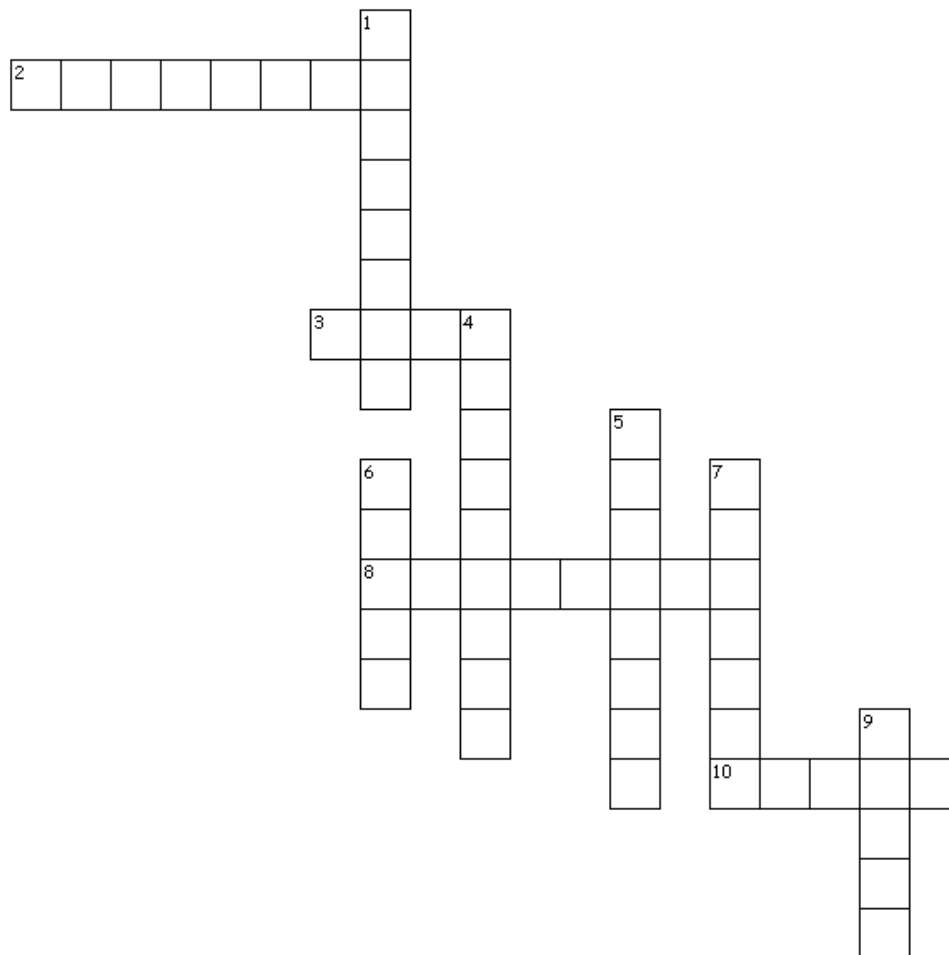

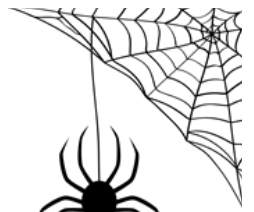
